

### **CONCLUSIONS**

- 1. Significant contribution to improved strategic frameworks, community participation, and justice services, especially in remote areas.
- 2. Efforts to improve planning, economic governance, women and youth empowerment, and formal economy transition had mixed results due to various challenges.
- 3. UNDP is testing a portfolio approach, but results are pending.
- 4. Localized interventions in the Great South are challenging but fully aligned with the goal of leaving no one behind.
- 5. Operationalizing the humanitarian, development and peace nexus has been identified as a necessary condition to achieve sustainable development in the Great South
- 6. Monitoring and gender mainstreaming can be enhanced.



### **RECOMMENDATIONS FOR UNDP**

- 1. Improve policy dialogue and advocacy efforts to reach the most vulnerable.
- **3**. Strengthen capacities of national partners at national and local levels.
  - **5**. Further define what a portfolio approach is and adapt organizational structure accordingly.
- **7**. Strengthen monitoring systems and pursue the implementation of adaptive management approaches.
