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Overall comments

Overall, the implementation of the Inclusive Growth Cluster's portfolio is in-line with the set plan, and the progress in achieving the objectives is good. The Inclusive Growth portfolio is very relevant, well designed and implemented, with good sustainability through its partnerships and involvement of stakeholders, and with a mixed approach in considering human rights and gender equality.
