Overall comments: The Terminal Evaluation reaffirms assessment per latest Annual Progress Report to the Forest Carbon Partnership Facility (FCPF). that the REDD+ project overall realized more than satisfactory performance, that it laid the foundation for Suriname Monitoring, Reporting and Verification system for compliance as well as market mechanism. Directly contributed to preparation of Suriname Forest Reference Emission Level and indirectly supported Suriname second Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC). The national capacity for REDD+ implementation although substantially improved to facilitate REDD+ implementation has gaps in areas of human and institutional systems and sustainability build in to sustain investments.

Evaluation Recommendation 1:				
At the highest level of the Government, actions are				
undertaken to develop a Green Development Vision and				
Action Plan to keep the Forest Cover at 93% and hence obtain				
considerable REDD+ Funding. This requires a strategic long-				
term development plan that refrains from large scale				
deforestation for cattle ranching, oil palm or other				
development programs except in the deforested areas of the				
coastal zone.
