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Executive summary

Key achievements of the campaign

The communication campaign on the promotion of tolerance in Ukraine has been implemented for over two years – from September 2018 to November 2020.

The overall campaign objective was to promote the values of tolerance and mutual understanding at various levels in Ukraine. This, in turn, has been accomplished through the establishment of a regional network of tolerance envoys, as well as a series of art and sports events and contests aimed at promoting the issues of tolerance and human rights.

To contribute to the objective of the campaign, the ICPS and UNDP measured the following achievements:

- ✓ 15 UNDP tolerance envoys were selected and involved in the campaign activities. Wellknown celebrities are now recognized as UNDP leaders on tolerance, human rights promotion, and anti-discrimination issues in Ukraine.
- ✓ The ICPS and UNDP selected and trained 40 leaders of mutual understanding from 20 regions of Ukraine. They have been involved in the campaign to communicate its ideas at the grass-root level.
- ✓ The ICPS and UNDP held **27 regional and Kyiv events** (workshops, discussions, performances, sports and youth events). Five of them were integrated into bigger national events to ensure maximum outreach.
- ✓ Overall reach of the regional and national events constitutes over **4 thousand people**.
- ✓ The ICPS and UNDP established partnerships with 41 organizations and representatives of local authorities.
- ✓ 46 articles of UNDP tolerance envoys and writers have reached over 500 thousand views.
- ✓ The KPI of the online course "Culture of Tolerance: How to Build a Proper Society for All", placed on the Prometheus educational platform, equaled to 32.4%. The number of students constituted over 2 thousand people (within 1,5 months from the start). The online course will contribute to the sustainability of the campaign after its end.
- ✓ Videos of the campaign have gathered over **250 thousand views** in total.
- The total reach of the campaign, including its direct participants and indirect reach (subscribers of the tolerance envoys, views of media articles and TV programs) constitutes approximately **3 million** people.

Global results of the campaign

The Communication Campaign on Promotion of Tolerance in Ukraine at the National and Oblast Levels in 2018/2020 has served as a continuation of the project implemented by the ICPS and supported by the UNDP in 2017-2018.

The goal of the communication campaign was to reduce the polarization of society and enhance the dialogue among various social groups through tolerance promotion in Ukraine at the national and oblast levels. In order to measure the effectiveness of the campaign in the context of achieving its main goal, it is worth comparing the results of the nation-wide research <u>"What Ukrainians Know and Think of Human Rights"</u> (polling in 2016) and the national sociological survey <u>"What Ukrainians know and think about human rights: assessment of changes (2016 - 2020)".</u>

Compared with the 2016 results, the number of Ukrainians for whom tolerance is a fundamental value has increased by 6 percent in 2020. In 2020, one-third of Ukrainians consider tolerance to be a fundamental value.

Compared with 2018, 2020 results show that Ukrainians' willingness to agree to restrictions on the rights of certain social groups has decreased, specifically their readiness to restrict the rights of representatives of the LGBTQI + community (-3.2 percent), homeless people (-1.8 percent), Roma people (-1.4 percent). Promoting tolerance to these groups has been the focus of the campaign.

According to the research, Ukrainians became more active in defending their rights and more tolerant of one another.

Thereby, the essence, relevance and urgency of the issues raised during the campaign, the popularity of the tolerance envoys, as well as their public recognition and high public demand for dialogue have contributed to the project's results. The results have evidenced the need to further communicate campaign messages to Ukrainian society.

Introduction

The Final Report includes an evaluation of all project activities during 2 years (September 2018 – November 2020) in the framework of the Contract for Services # UKR/2018/035 from September, 06th, 2018 (Amendment #1 dated September, 7^{th,} 2020) on implementation of the communication campaign on promotion of tolerance in Ukraine at national and oblast levels.

Goal and objectives of the campaign

The goal of the communication campaign is to reduce the polarization in society and strengthen dialogue among various social groups through tolerance promotion in Ukraine at the national and oblast levels.

Overall campaign objective: Promotion of the values of tolerance and mutual understanding at various levels in Ukraine through the establishment of a regional network of tolerance envoys, as well as a series of arts and sports events and contests aimed at promoting the issues of tolerance and human rights.

Other objectives of the campaign:

- To enhance the UNDP Tolerance Envoys Institute, represented by well-known celebrities and opinion-leaders in the following fields arts, science, eco-activism, music, cinematography, theatre, sport, human rights or/and literature.
- To raise awareness about the value of human rights, issues of tolerance, mutual respect and dialogue in the Ukrainian society through online training course.
- To engage wider audiences by providing knowledge about: the interconnection between tolerance and peacebuilding, understanding of diversity, definition and measurement of tolerance, mechanisms of building a lasting peace, ways of building tolerant discussions and ensuring tolerance in socially sensitive groups.
- To scale up the Tolerance campaign, expanding it to the regional level, i.e. creating a network of regional tolerance leaders and promoters, which are expected to communicate the campaign messages and wider UNDP agenda at the grass-roots level in Ukraine.
- To develop partnerships with regional civil society organizations and activists in order to promote activities of aspiring tolerance envoys in regions;

to integrate and interconnect the networks of national and regional tolerance promoters with activities of the UNDP SDG localization network.

- To integrate the project events with big national events to ensure maximum promotion for the value of human rights, issues of tolerance, mutual respect and dialogue in the Ukrainian society.

The target groups of the project are:

- youth;
- representatives of local communities;
- civil society;
- vulnerable groups (IDPs, people with disabilities, etc.);
- state governments and local authorities;
- media.

The key messages, which were used during the project activities, are the following:

- Focus on discussing the future rather than the past.
- Different opinions on the same subject have the right to exist.
- Nobody's opinion is an absolute truth.
- Be self-critical, not prejudiced.
- Do not personalize one's opinion.
- Find unity in diversity.
- Refrain from negative emotions during a disagreement.
- Listening to others will prevent future conflicts.
- Communication with different people makes you open-minded.
- Let us learn from each other.
- Give a helping hand to persons with disabilities.
- Do not judge a person by his or her age.
- Multilingual people are more successful.
- No one was born racist.
- Cultural diversity empowers you.
- IDPs are the same Ukrainian citizens as you.

1. Selection of 15 UNDP Tolerance Envoys. Developing of the concept design for a national campaign on tolerance promotion. Deliverable 1

1.1. Selection of 15 UNDP Tolerance Envoys

During September - October, 2018, 15 UNDP tolerance envoys were selected together with UNDP. Communication with 11 UNDP tolerance envoys-participants of the Communication Campaign on Promotion of Tolerance in Ukraine in 2017/2018 was re-established. 4 new tolerance envoys were selected.

UNDP tolerance envoys are well-known celebrities and opinion-leaders in the following fields – arts, science, eco-activism, music, theatre, sport, human rights, literature.

Profiles of the UNDP tolerance envoys



Liubko DERESH is a poet, writer, one of the pioneers of modern Ukrainian literature.

He was once named a writer-wunderkind by criticts. The first publication is the novel "Cult", which he wrote in his 15 years. Having received a considerable amount of positive reviews about his first work, Lyubko Deresh publishes novels "Lizard Worship" (2002), "Arche" (2005), "Intention!" (2006), "A Little

Darkness" (2007). His works are translated into several European languages (German, Polish, Italian, Serbian, etc.).

Deresh has been leading and engaging in a number of cultural and literature educational projects.

The writer formulates his creative credo as follows: "I am interested in strengthening the human consciousness. Starting from the book "Archaea", my subsequent books are intended to awaken awareness in the person."



Alevtyna KAKHIDZE is a Ukrainian artist-performer, painter, actionist. She was born in the city of Zhdanivka in the Donetsk region. Being a student Alevtina became the winner of the II Ukrainian Contest of Young Curators and Artists, which made it possible to make their first personal exhibition at the Center for Contemporary Art called "Invitation to Australia, or the Museum of One History." She studied in the Netherlands at the academy of Jan Wan Eika at the

Visual Arts Department.

Her works were exhibited in Kyiv at the Center for Contemporary Art, Pinchuk Art Center, as well as in the Netherlands. In her work Alevtina uses a mixture of different types of art, video works and installations. Among the recent art projects is the book «Zhdanovka» (the city in Donetsk region, which is now not controlled by Ukrainian government), and recording of phone dialogues and conversations with her mother (who lived in uncontrolled territory) about the life and war.



Andriy KULYKOV is a journalist, editor, radio broadcaster, TV presenter, media expert, media coach. He graduated from the International Relations and International Law Faculty of the Kyiv State University named after Taras Shevchenko in specialties on international relations.

Andriy has been working in journalism since 1979. He was a correspondent and a deputy chief editor of News from Ukraine newspaper (Kyiv), producer at the Ukrainian Service of BBC, editor and deputy director of Television Service of News at 1+1 Studio, chief-editor of Novyi Channel.

Andriy Kuykov is well known for being a TV presenter at the political TV-show Svoboda Slova (Freedom of Speech) at ICTV Channel and a radio anchor at ERA radio for many years. He is one of Hromadske Radio founders.



Larysa DENYSENKO is a writer, lawyer and human rights activist. Graduated from Taras Shevchenko University of Kyiv with a degree in Law. Larysa worked as advisor of the Minister of Justice, she was the First Deputy Head control of rights in international organizations at the Ministry of Justice of Ukraine. Besides, she was a Chairman of the national global anticorruption organization Transparency International. Larysa owns the distinction from the

Supreme Court of Ukraine "For loyalty to the law". Larysa came to journalism in 2006 as an author and host of a cultural program "Document" at 1+1 tv channel. Now she is a radio-presenter at Hromadke radio, hosts a cycle of programms on human rights and legal protection.

Special attention is given to Larysa's literary experience. Her novels were numerously recognized by various awards. She is also a co-author of the manual National Integrity System - assembly of the Council of Europe on the death penalty; the Manual on Human Rights for teachers' trainers; Book of Judges; author of educational technique about human rights for children.



Yevhen ZAKHAROV is a human rights defender, director of Kharkiv Human Rights Protection Group, former hairman of the Board of the Ukrainian Helsinki Human Rights Union.

He is a well-known author of works on human rights, civil society and the history of political repression in the Soviet Union and in Ukraine.

After the Revolution of Dignity, Yevhen Zakharov was appointed as a head of the Expert Council for Police Reform at the Ministry of Internal Affairs of Ukraine, which was established in April 2014.



Katya CHILLY (real name Kateryna Bogolyubova) is a modern Ukrainian singer, musician and composer. She released five albums that received considerable attention from the press and the public.

Since the mid-90s, Katya's work focuses on the pop avant-garde project, combining pragmatical ritual singing with the most modern arranged music. From the very beginning of her musical career, Katya became the winner of

many song contests and festivals, including the famous Ukrainian festival "Chervona Ruta". In March 2001, Katya performed with a concert program in London, where she gave more than 40 concerts. Katya's performance was broadcast live by BBC. This company also shot a live video of the singer, who was aired on the air of the channel.

In 2017, he received a new wave of popularity in Ukraine after her participation in a song contest "Voice of the country". Today Katya is focusing on an acoustic program in which there is no electronic music at all.



Slava VARDA is an athlete, journalist, television and radio broadcaster. He is the Master of Sports of Ukraine in athletics. Since 2006 he has been working on TV. Varda worked as a special correspondent, commentator on the first Ukrainian sports channel "Sport 1" and as a news presenter on the "New Channel".

Since 2012, he has been hosting a number of TV and radio shows involving famous sportsmen, trainers and football players. From August 2016 he leads the morning airs "Varda de Janeiro" with the UBR channel. Now he is conducting the author's program "Politics of Champions" on the NewsOne Channel.



Maryana SAVKA is a poet, literary critic, publicist, editor-in-chief and cofounder of the Old Lion Publishing House, translator, public figure, member of the Council of Center for the Study of Children's and Youth's Literature, and vice-president of the "Great Hedgehog" literary prize, member of the Association of Ukrainian Writers and the National Union of Writers of Ukraine. She graduated from Lviv State University named after Ivan Franko, Faculty of

Ukrainian Philology.

Maryana Savka came to the list of "100 most influential women of Ukraine" twice according to the magazine "Focus". In 2016 she entered the ranking of "40 personalities that change the country" according to the version of the leading weekly "BUSINESS". In 2017 she won the annual BOOM AWARDS 2017 in the "Face of Lviv" nomination. In February 2016 Maryana Savka initiated a project "12 incredible women about the values that make a person".



Pavlo VYSHEBABA is a journalist, musician, civic activist and co-founder and member of the "Unique Planet" initiative - a unique movement of climate protection, and environmental initiatives.

He graduated from Mariupol State University in journalism specialty. During the Revolution of Dignity, he was active as a member of Maidan

and international communication. He is also a leader of the music band "One Planet Orchestra" and Founder of the "Hutro Off" initiative (for the ban on fur farms and fur production in Ukraine).



Nataliya SUMSKA is an actress of theater and cinema, television hostess, awarded with the Shevchenko National Prize (2008) and the People's Artist of Ukraine (2000). She has had more than 30 roles in the theater and more than 40 in the cinema.

In 1977 Nataliya Sumska graduated from the Kyiv State Institute of Theatrical Arts of Karpenko-Karyi. The same year she became an actress at the Franko National Academical Drama Theater. In 2000 she became a laureate of the national theater award "Kyiv pectoral" for her role in the Chekhov's "Three Sisters" play. Since December 2016, she is a member of the Taras Shevchenko National Prize Committee.



Mykhailo MINAKOV is a philosopher and historian. His major philosophical investigations focus on human experience, social knowledge, political system, historical consciousness, and multiple modernities.

Mykhailo Minakov started his academic career as a part-time Assistant Professor at Kyiv-Mohyla Academy. In 2001 he published his first book

'Kant's Teaching on the Faith of Reason". Than, for several years, Prof. Minakov cooperated with several Western universities: Harvard University, Greifswald University, Wilson Centre for International Scholars.

Mykhailo was a Fellow at Harvard Ukrainian Research Institute, Kennan Institute and Krupp Wisseschaftskolleg Greifswald.



Eugenia ARATOVSKA

Founder of NGO "Ukraine without waste" (Ukrainian sustainable waste recycling social enterprise), Waste Management Expert.

Worked with Austrian embassy in Ukraine, France Embassy in Ukraine, Renault Ukraine, Yves Rocher, Platinum Bank Ukraine, Ciklum and Epam and more than 400 others Ukrainian companies to communicate their socially responsible work

culture and inclusion and diversity programs.

Women Business Talent contest finalist. Founder of social projects #GoodDeedMaster and #NoWasteRecyclingStation. Resident of the Kyiv Smart City Hub.



Dmytro SCHEBETYUK

Ukrainian activist, athlete, blogger, traveler, co-founder of "Доступно.UA" initiative ("Accessible. UA"), host of the section "Inclusion" of TV program "#@)?\$0" on "UA: First" TV channel.

In February 2011, damaged the spine as a result of the fall, and since then he moves in a wheelchair. Dmytro perceives the injury as a challenge and he is actively engaged in social activities and inclusion issues in Ukraine.

Master of sports in swimming, multiple prize winner of Ukraine. Included in the reserve of the Paralympic archery team.

Dmytro is the founder of the "Dostupno UA" initiative, which appeared in 2015 to monitor various facilities for their accessibility to people with disabilities.

Dmytro Schebetyuk is among 100 most influential Ukrainians in 2017 by FOCUS.

Entered the top of the young Ukrainian leaders under the age of 30 by Kyiv Post version.



Zola KONDUR

Zola Kondur has been working on Roma issues in Ukraine for close to 20 years and has been internationally active since 2000.

She has been working on Roma issues in Ukraine for close to 20 years and is one of the most renowned advocates for the tolerance to and integration of Roma

community.

In recent years Ms Kondur has worked for the Council of Europe and for the European Roma Rights Centre as a Project Manager and as a consultant. From 2004-present time she has been the vice-president of the International Charitable Organization "Roma women's fund "Chiricli"". Zola Kondur is currently the National Project Officer for ROMED2 in Ukraine.



Marko HALANEVYCH

Musician, band "DakhaBrakha".

DakhaBrakha – is world-music quartet from Kyiv. Reflecting fundamental elements of sound and soul, Ukrainian «ethnic chaos» band DakhaBrakha, create a world of unexpected new music.

In March 2010 DakhaBrakha won one of the most prestigious Grand Prix prize named after S.Kuriokhin in the sphere of contemporary art and confirmed its actuality once again.

The band has many tours abroad. Therefore, the team members consider, one of their missions is to tell people about Ukraine.

He is an actor of the Kiev Center for Contemporary Art "DAKH".

Marco is fond of photography. A photo exhibition with his works was recently organized in Kyiv. Dakha Brakha band is Shevchenko Prize 2020 winner.

1.2. Developing the concept design for communication campaign on promotion of tolerance in Ukraine at the National and Oblast Levels

The concept design for a national campaign on tolerance promotion was developed. Communication Strategy contained resources that were engaged; timeline of stages of 7informational campaign development and their objectives; PR plan and other guidelines for implementation of the campaign.

2. Selection of leaders of mutual understanding (1-3 in each of 20 oblasts). Deliverable 3

To promote the values of tolerance, mutual understanding and dialogue in the Ukrainian society, ICPS scaled up the campaign expanding it to the level of regions, i.e. creating a network of regional tolerance leaders and promoters, which were communicating the campaign messages and wider UNDP agenda at the grass-root level in Ukraine.

The evaluation of the candidates was made by ICPS and Tolerance envoys, taking into account the recommendations provided by the UNDP Oblast SDGs Coordinators

3.1. Conducting outreach events

The campaign has rapidly gained its popularity and support among wide public as the unique initiative for Ukraine. It was especially evident at the grass-root level in Ukrainian regions, where the ICPS received numerous requests from the public to continue the campaign activities. During the project, 27 events (workshops, discussions, performances, sports and youth events) were held. 5 of them have been integrated with bigger national events to ensure the maximum outreach.

Overall reach of the regional events is more than 2 thousand people and near 2 thousand people more is the reach of the national events.





3.2. Conduction of the contest of social advertising videos

The problem

The United Nations established Zero Discrimination Day, to be marked around the world on 1 March, to remind us that everyone has the right to a decent life, regardless of their age, gender, sexual orientation, national or ethnic origin, appearance, profession, beliefs, and so on.

While the discrimination practiced by certain states against some categories of their own citizens is subject to oversight by international organizations, discrimination at the individual level is harder to combat. Even developed democracies cannot counter it completely. Ukraine is no exception.



Therefore, in order to increase the level of respect in Ukrainian society, the #RespectUA campaign and UNDP Ukraine called on the public to make short films on the subject.

The mechanism of conducting the Zero Discrimination minifilm competition

1. Submit a portfolio and a few sentences about the team by 28 January, 2020.

2. 5 teams were selected to receive UAH 35,000 to shoot a minifilm about tolerance lasting from 30 seconds to five minutes.

3. Shoot the minifilms and submit them by 27 February, 2020. Topics to choose for a story:

- Problems of intolerance in Ukraine: the interpersonal level
- Discrimination on social, religious, racial, national, gender and other grounds
- Diversity enriches society, and each of us
- Protecting human rights
- Gender inequality
- A society in which to live at ease: respect, equality, zero discrimination
- Be yourself, and allow others to be different from you
- Tolerant treatment of people with HIV/AIDS
- How to tackle discrimination: civic activity of Ukrainians who care
- It's time to treat animals humanely and ethically

The winning team, selected by a jury, received a prize of UAH 40,000 and their video was promoted online and offline. The winner was announced on 28 February. 5 teams (from 36 applicants) were selected by the Molodiya Festival representatives and UNDP tolerance envoys and they started the process of social ads' creating.

Results of the Zero Discrimination minifilm competition

The jury (UNDP tolerance envoys and Molodiya Social Ads Festival) evaluated the video according to the following criteria: explaining the topic, motivating positive action, and creativity. As per the goal of the contest, all finalists covered important topics of discrimination in Ukraine, each of which is worthy of special attention.

The winner of the "Zero Discrimination" minifilm contest, devoted to international Zero Discrimination Day, has been declared on February 28, 2020 in Kyiv.

Filming in stark black and white, Lagutin interviews several of Kyiv's estimated 20,000 homeless people, stripping away the stereotypes imposed them, and exposing the talents, likes, qualifications and characters of each of his subjects. The message – that these are people just like any others, only without homes – is hammered in with each shot. The 2-minute, 18-second film ends with short portraits of each of his subjects, and the final title "Everyone deserves respect."

From that day on, Kramdada gives up eating meat. Kramdada's father, a former musician, became a farmer and took the role of the village butcher – he advises others on how best to slaughter an animal, and slaughters animals on behalf of others who find it "unpleasant" or who "don't like

blood." At the end, Kramdada fantasises about throwing away her father's killing axe and enjoying a vegetarian meal with him. The minifilm reminds us that discrimination and the issue of rights may not be confined just to our own species. The last title informs us that in the two days it took to shoot the film, 400 million animals were slaughtered for food.

Infused with dark humour, Yudin's minifilm sees a gay couple fanaticise over the death of "her," and the burial of "her" body. It emerges that "she" is discrimination (the word "discrimination," pronounced "diskriminatsiya"

in Ukrainian, is a noun with feminine grammatical gender.) "So: Can we live a normal life now?" asks one of the heroes of the film, before we are shown shots of the couple dancing, hugging, kissing and holding hands. "The main thing is that nobody digs her up again," muses the main character, and the minifilm ends with the closing title: "In Memory of Discrimination."

4. Art contest "Challenging intolerance with cartoons". Deliverable 5

Partners of the contest

The main activities of the school are: teaching design skills, encouraging professional growth of those people who form the industry, developing professional competencies for further work in the design and creative industries.

36 participants of the workshop (designers and artists) took part in visualization of tolerance in Ukraine, got experience of interdisciplinary cooperation which will be useful in any field.







Summary

The campaign's goal was to promote the values of tolerance, mutual understanding and dialogue in Ukrainian society – especially in the regions.

Regional events (workshops, discussions, performances, sports and youth events) with the participation of Tolerance Envoys have overall reached thousands of people. After participating in these interactive activities, the participants shared their experience on social media and promoted the campaign's ideas. The participation of Tolerance Envoys in big national events helped to educate the public and raise awareness on the need for inclusive nationwide dialogue, at the same time explaining the connection between tolerance and peace.

As opinion leaders of the campaign, Tolerance Envoys have made numerous Facebook posts on the issues of mutual understanding and tolerance, thus prompting their audience to closely consider these matters. In addition, Tolerance Envoys have extensively talked about the campaign in a plethora of interviews.

During the Tolerance campaign, TV and online-media journalists have repeatedly asked many of the Envoys to comment on the topics of tolerance, combating discrimination, etc. This, in turn, demonstrates their recognition as UNDP leaders on tolerance issues and illustrates a general increase of interest for mutual respect in Ukraine.

Creating a network of regional leaders on mutual understanding helped to communicate the campaign message at Ukraine's grassroots level.

Those Tolerance Envoys who are writers have monthly published their opinions and blogs in the country's well-known online-media. It raised the issues of tolerance in Ukraine, successfully delivering the campaign's messages.

The campaign's key messages to promote tolerant discussions include the following:

- Understanding other narratives will create an atmosphere of trust, which, in turn, will help to prevent potential conflicts between persons with polar mindsets.
- Preventing polarization and a 'You're either with us or against us' mentality. Focusing on creating an environment of inclusiveness rather than exploiting differences. Find ing unity in diversity by focusing on the aspects that unite rather than divide society.
- Communicating with people from different backgrounds (ethnic, religious, cultural) or views will help broaden one's perspectives.

The online course "Culture of Tolerance: How to Build a Proper Society for All" will contribute to sustainability of the campaign after it's end.

Using a variety of forms while conducting public Tolerance Envoys succeeded to neutralize aggressiveness and to "open" different audiences to talk about tolerance, diversity, non-violence as not just universal values but as benefits which personally everyone can use.
