**Overall comments:** Recommendations are intended for planned second Phase of the GCCA+ project. Climate Change has to be managed through a pluri- and cross sectoral approach due to its complexity. Services to manage and implement CC activities and projects are scarce; Climate activities in Suriname involve different ministries and local authorities. Good stakeholder engagement and continuous communication with government partners is also a key for a successful implementation; Regular inter-departmental discussion at policy and technical level could result improved coordination of national CC Adaptation initiatives.


